


Visiting the Garden of Suprises and Sculpture Garden






As I arrive at Burghley House, I might hear the gentle hum of car engines as other visitors park their cars. The gravel underfoot may crunch as I step out, and I might feel the breeze on my face. Birds may be singing in the trees, and I might notice the scent of fresh grass or flowers nearby

I follow the crunchy path from the car park to the Gardens entrance, I hear the excited chatter of other families all around me. I may have to wait in line at the ticket kiosk so that other families can have their ticket checked. When it is my turn, I go to the ticket Kiosk, and a friendly member of staff will say hello to me and check my ticket. I will know they are staff members as they will have a Burghley House uniform on. It is okay to speak to staff members at any time if I need help.









I am ready to start my adventure, and I head through the bushy arch into the Garden of Surprises. The ground here is smooth and hard. I may hear the sound of my footsteps as I make my way into the garden.

The sound of water fills the air, and I see a row of little fountains ahead of me. I can't touch the water as there is a cover over them, but I watch as the lights change colour and listen to the sounds they make. I like the sound — it's soothing.

I may catch a glimpse of my reflection as I walk past a large mirror hidden behind an old tree. I have only just started my adventure, and I am already excited by what I see!











I move on to find a huge cauldron! I watch as it starts to steam — I hope there's nothing cooking in there!

Near the cauldron are large pictures of trees. I stand and watch them as water falls down over them. Little leaves move in the flow.

I like to watch the water and see the leaves move.







Every corner I turn, there is something new to see!

There's a water rill running down the path, with lovely rows of lavender growing on either side. The smell of the flowers is wonderful, and I see bees buzzing busily from one bloom to the next.

At the end of the path, it looks like there's a cave — I want to go and explore!









I turn another corner and spot a swirly fountain, spraying water in a fun pattern. I can hear the splash as the water hits the ground — it sounds like soft rain.

Just around the bend, hidden behind a bush, is a large tube of bubbles that lights up! The bubbles rise and sparkle. This is fun to watch, and it makes me feel quite peaceful.

I follow the path up a slight ramp. I run to the top so I can see the whole of the garden. From up here, I feel like I am the King







As I walk along the path, I find a strange-looking object in the middle of a circle — it's a sundial!

It stands tall on chunky stone legs, like a tiny castle. I walk around it slowly. The top is smooth and shiny, with patterns and numbers carved into the surface. There's a long metal arm sticking up and casting a shadow across the top.

I notice the sunlight hitting it just right, and the shadow points to a number. This is how people used to tell the time — using the sun!



I run my hands gently over the carvings. They feel warm from the sun and a little bumpy beneath my fingers.

I take a moment to stand still beside it, feeling the sunshine on my face and listening to the garden sounds all around me.





Now I find myself at the Mirror Maze. It's shiny and bright, and I can see my reflection in so many places — in front of me, beside me, even behind me! I take a careful step forward, but bump gently into the glass. Oops! I giggle. It's tricky to know which way to go.

I can see lights bouncing around and hear the sound of footsteps echoing off the glass. It feels a bit funny in here — exciting and a little confusing — but I know I can find my way through

Once I've found the exit to the Mirror Maze, I see steam rising from the Moss House — there might be a dragon sleeping in there!

I'm feeling brave. I know there's no such thing as real dragons... so I go in! As I step inside, I'm sprayed with a cooling mist. It's light and refreshing — it doesn't make me too wet, just cools me down. I follow the path all the way around, looking carefully, just in case I spot a tail or a puff of smoke... but when I come out the other side, not one dragon to be found!









Next, I see a corridor of trees that I want to explore.

There are four tall towers, and as I get closer, I notice buttons I can press. I feel curious — I wonder what will happen when I try them?

I start with the first button on the Fire tower — and suddenly, steam begins to rise! I gasp in surprise, then smile. That was exciting!

I move to the Earth tower and push its button. The tower slowly starts to turn. It feels magical, like I've just discovered a secret.

I'm really enjoying this, so I hurry over to the next one.

The Wind tower blows bubbles into the air — I laugh as I try to catch and pop them before they float away. It feels playful and fun.

Finally, I press the button on the Water tower. It sprays a soft mist — not enough to make me wet, just cool and refreshing. I feel calm and happy.









I follow the path and soon hear the sound of splashing water ahead.

In front of me is a tall wall of fountains — a curtain made of water! It shoots up from the ground and falls in a straight line across the path. It looks like there's no way through without getting soaked!

But then... the water suddenly stops . . . I smile — this is a magic fountain curtain! It knows when someone wants to go through.

I take a deep breath and step forward. Just as I walk through, the water stays off — I don't get wet at all! It feels clever and exciting, like part of a secret adventure.

Once I'm through, the fountains start again behind me, splashing and dancing in the sunshine. I feel proud, happy, and full of wonder from everything I've seen.
